Lok Kalyan Sansthan

Lok Kalyan Sansthan was formed with a vision of equitable and just society, where everyone can live without fear, hunger, and corruption. It was an individual effort, which motivated several other to take a shape of an organization. Founder of this organization was a fellow of the developmental studies and during his fellowship, he decided to establish an organization to address the plight of the community, to whom he belongs.

Lok kalyan sansthan is a non-government non-profit making and politically independent organization, registered under Rajasthan Societies Registration Act-1958. The organization from last Twenty-five years is working on the prominent issues of the community like Education, Health, migrants, Agriculture, emergency, and Drinking water with a view to address the plight of the people and enhancing its intervention to the poverty reduction.

Mission: Social, and economic empowerment of disadvantaged and marginalized section of the society, especially women, children and Migrants, so that they can be self-reliant and empowered enough to assert their due share and right to the mainstream of development.

Vision: Organization visualizes its vision through minimizing fear, hunger and corruption in the community for the cause to establish an equitable and just society, based on values where every individual can enjoy their fundamental rights, guaranteed under Indian Constitution.

Values: Lok Kalyan Sansthan recognizes value as flesh and blood of an organization. Organization is determined to promote itself as a valued organization, which was established to address the social causes and is committed for the development of its people. Organization identifies Democracy, Transparency, and Decentralization as its risen values. These values are the foundation of LKS family and it has grown itself on this moral basis.

Principles: LKS has identified its principle for working along with its targeted (SC, ST, OBC and differently able) community for their upliftment -

1. No harm to environment as it has been identified as the core of every activity
2. Following Indian constitution and raising voice against any inequality.
3. No discrimination against Dalits, women, minorities and DIVYANGS.
4. No Practice of Untouchability from the organizational staff and all events with community.
5. No any palace to discrimen on the basis of Cast, Zander or Religious.
6. The Rights of Animals are also equal to Human rights on Common resources of Earth.

Activities are undertaken in year 2021-22 are as below

A. **Health, Nutrition and Hygiene** - Health Problems in deserts are much different than the other part of country. The one side is the lack of opportunity to take nutritionally valued fruits and Green vegetables, whereas, another side is that people are not much aware about the nutrition and dietary concern. Peoples are living in scattered housing, situated in far flanged areas, each home is far almost 1 km from another house and reach of medical services like vaccination, services for pregnant women, older population and children is a big issue. In this type of scenarios, people are ignoring the vaccination and main stream medical treatment, and preferring to reach out to local priests and quakes, called as BHOPAs and Ojhas, to address their plight.

KODH ME KHAJ - Due to lack of information and awareness about COVID-19, all the migrants come home from the destination and are not aware about the distance maintenance and COVID protocols laid down by the government, the result of which, many of them lose their time agility and health. The population are completely destroyed. COVID-19 routine vaccination and testing practices are completely messed up, many people died during COVID but not declared COVID due to lack of COVID test.

- i. **Covid vaccination / Awareness Drive** - we have organized the Panchayat level camps with Govt officials and staff. Created awareness about the vaccination and given proper guidance for that. Peoples have taken the benefits from vaccination but after several counseling only. We have facilitated the vaccination drive. Total 20 Gram panchayat selected for vaccination and covered 15,580 persons with COVID first Dose, where more than 80% of them reaches to Third Dose.



- ii. **Awareness camps** - Total 60 Camps organized in above 20 Panchayat, 3 camps in each panchayat for vaccination, awareness, checkup and treatments. Covered 15,000 peoples to checkup and awareness benefits.



- iii. **Medical camps** - In above 20 Camps, we have selected the patients for COVID Centers referral, pregnant women and children for vaccination and other older person for smaller treatment at door steps. Few serious patients have been referred for further treatment at PHC Baytu.

iv. **Traditional Vidhya Treatments** - We have a network of Traditional Vidhya and as per there traditional knowledge and practice of local medicine like Ayurveda and Homeopathy treatments, we have been able to reach out to several number of people. We are promoting few practices and they are cheap and easy to access by the local peoples and they have much believed on it. We have given a platform to knowledge sharing by each other and combined their preparation of the medicine by local JARIBUTI. We have selected 10 Person for further treatment and totally 265 patients recovered by this type of practice in last year.

v. **Eye Camps / Selection of beneficiary for operation** - Desert have some special type of situation which results into some very special problem related to eyes being faced by the peoples. Eye care is a one of them. Mostly 75 percent people get the problem once in a year. Sand particles falls in eyes by desert storms, and this is a common problem here and locally few peoples are experts in that to treat it. We have shared some safety parameters to take care while removing the sand from eyes and measures related to aftercare. Apart from this, we have organized eye care camps for checkup and identified the cases, where operation is required. These operations are mainly of cataract, retina replacement or eye injury etc. Total 1,440 peoples have taken benefit by our eye care program, in which 140 people's have got their eye retina treated in Barmer and Jodhpur Hospital with the help of our reference.



vi. **Village water and Sanitation groups formation**, activation etc. - We are working with LNT limited and PHED of Rajasthan Govt. at Rani block of Pali district on the issues related to water sanitation and access. Here we have completed our effort in 26 villages, where we have been able to improve the community sanitation practices and increased the access to safe drinking water. First, we have formed a village level group and then gave training on the management of water structure. Peoples themselves selected the common points, pipe line, staff care taker and all respective work like, site map and plan preparation. Cost of water has been collected from each household and kept the amount in a bank account, operated by a local self-help group. We have facilitated the water and sanitation work in the villages but now it's a self-sustain model where people themselves taking the role



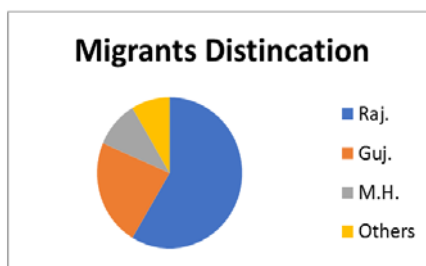
and responsibility of all distribution, collection of fees and management related to drinking water in each house. People are taking equal responsibility and equal and adequate quantity of water without any fear and discrimination of caste, gender or religious biases. Communities belonging to special group like ST, SC, OBC and Minority also taking proper share in distribution.

B. **Livelihood** - Economical sustainability gives the social security and justice. We believe in this and our main efforts are fully dedicated to give an economical sustainability to communities who are suffering from financial challenges. If any person is financially independent, then we found that he/she has less fear and discrimination in the society. Our believe in this is that people must earn the livelihood but also the expenses management is the major part of livelihood. People migrates for earning the wage for survival but when they come back home, there are many expenses which can finish all their savings, mostly in health and water expenses. People can manage their savings by awareness or investment or access to the facilities, but there is a need to facilitate to make their reach to them. Our efforts are to make access to the facilities and create awareness among communities about these facilities, to meet their health and education needs, as well as, develop their skill to improve their income level.

- i. **Skill Building-** Skill building can give some better opportunity to work, long time survival and much more income. Here in this area, people mostly migrate in age group of 15 to 20 years, who are mostly unskilled and drop out for school. So, we have a clear mindset for selection of Job (Subject), which depend on our experience and new coming opportunity (after undertaking market study). Selection of beneficiaries are mostly in the age group of 17 to 30, those who are new, should have some technical expertise / knowledge so that they can survive in the labor market and earn sufficient to meet their need. Another important outcome of our study and experience that skilled labor can work up to 55 years while unskilled works maximum up to 42 years only. This is a big gap in labor markets (42 to 55 years) a large number of people are non-productive in this age. In the absence of any tangible assets or agricultural land, they do not have any productive value. We have given training to 180 youth (Electrician- 40, Plumber 20. Electric welding 60, west wood toys- 40 and accounts and soft activities- 40)



ii. **Migrants support Program-** Migrants population support is our basic intervention in the community, continually from last 15 years. This initiative has been supported to us by Tata trust for 10 years but after that we have continued doing some activities as below - Migrants registration new- 1,500, counselling for legal, health hazardous and financial support to 170 migrants, Skill linkages of 22 youth, identity card issuance support to 1,340 migrants during the year. Two visits of destination; one at Kandla and another at Mumbai has been organized for humane support to the migrants.

iii. **Agriculture Support** - Agriculture is a prime source of income of rural India, but now a days, is not profitable. Regular Drought, irregular rainfall, rainfed irrigation, absence of drinkable underground water and desert conditions of area, has much challenges in agriculture practices. We are providing guidance and some physical exercise with local farmers like - Seeds treatment in 1,000-hectare bajra, insurance and Kisan Credit Card (KCC) access to new 125 farmer, insurance guidance to 190 farmers. Advocacy and linkages to make reach and access of farmers to agriculture department of District and application for farm pond (5), horticulture practices (10) and seed support to 35 Farmers has been efforts to provide direct benefits to the farmers.

iv. **Rain water Harvesting-** Thar Desert have only option for drinking water and that is Tanka (Ground based rain water harvesting structure). This is a common for each house. It's made by communities themselves. Its construction is costly and from our support, 1,100 Tanka has been built, in which support has also been drawn from MNREGA scheme etc. Each and every household have one or more tanka in their premises for drinking water purpose. In this year we have just made a common call for catchment cleaning in 3 villages, as the amount of rain-water harvested depends on how good is the catchment area. Total 250 catchment for each tanka has been cleaned. As water stored in Tanka is not very clean for drinking purposes, water has been treated in tanka by bleaching powder for hygiene purpose.

v. **Village water groups training,** Contribution self-managements system developments - With the help of PHED Department, Govt of Rajasthan, Larcen & Turbon limited have supported us with an initiative under Jal Jeevan Mission, in which, one tap for each household has been provisioned. A pipeline has been installed from water source to village and then door step tap facility has been built by the organization, in support with

the govt. All planning, laying, decision for common points, and overall management for long time, fees collection and all water management body were functional by our efforts. It is called as village health and sanitation group and we have facilitated their formation and strengthening. All 26 villages now have a village group which will take the responsibility of water supply management in the communities. We are proud to facilitate the much important sustainable group formation and orientation.

C. **Artisan Support** - May be few decades ago, human started the art works for hobby or any new creations, and after making something, peoples may become happy. But now a days, after a time the arts of peoples also became an earning skill. Where prime occupation may not be the art but on many example many of them earning by art can be more than their other incomes. The stone carving, wooden carving, waste-wood work, iron carving, glass work etc. are the main example of arts work in this part of Thar Desert in India.

i. **Stone Artisans Survey / Selection** - People of area are very familiars to stone construction, and after some practice and interest, slowly they become good carving artisans. This then become their primary occupation and they move to be come an artisan from daily wage laborer. For strengthening their skill, we did a complete survey of 5 villages and found 290 Artisans those are having skill of stone carving and they live in single cluster of villages. These artisans lack market, networking and local working opportunity. Also, there is no cfc and they are not organized. They are also limited by mobility and cannot go very far to work. This results into low earning and many types of exploitation happens, as they are in unorganized artisan sectors.

ii. **CFC Construction-** After learning about such exploitation, we planned and took the opportunity with MSME SFURTI program for artisan's development facility center, CFC, at Baytu, where total Rs 257.50 lakh are sanctioned for the machinery, building, raw material and software support for marketing. Further planning to market exhibition and promotion activities were done. CFC was furnished by all type of stone carving and cutting machines like gengshow, CNG machine, stone lath machine, gentry crane, Glass engraving machine etc. which are helpful to artisans, to do effective work and earn more.



iii. **Approval of a Project from MSME-** A project was granted under SFURTI scheme of MSME of GOI for the CFC and all type of artisan help. Artisans should be registered under PMSBY, PMJSY and other related schemes of social security. Each artisan was awarded by artisan card by State govt and Central Govt.

iv. **Land and DPR complete** - One bigha land for Artisan center has been arranged by Lok Kalyan Sansthan (LKS) by its own resources. For this entire setup, DPR has been made with the help of Swami **Vivekanand Global University** Jaipur and KVIC (**Khadi & Village Industries commission** Bikaner). These two eminent institutions will take the responsibility of Nodal agency and guide the project, all along.

v. **Waste Wood Artisan Training** - Thar desert peoples have many skills, to earn their livelihood. The low agriculture yields and regular drought has motivated the peoples to earn from alternative ways. The Wooden carving skill is a another most popular arts in the area and we got an opportunity to give a good direction to this art. After wooden work, there are a lot of scrap scattered around the houses and workshop. So, we gave the training to the interested artisans to make many items and toys, named as "Waste Wood Production". Total 240 Artisan has got the opportunity to make the various item of wood by using the waste wood or wood scrap. After the production is done, it is hard to differentiate that these items were made from fresh wood or waste wood. With the financially help of Khadi and Village industries commission Jaipur/ Bikaner and Technical Support of Technical Institute Kolkata has given the training to 240 Artisans of our area. After completion of training, we have given toolkits to all artisans for further work at home using waste wood and other wood work forms.



vi. **Waste Wood Product Exhibition** - All 12 groups of 20 artisan (total 240 Artisans) have made various production using wasted wood, we have exhibited all in craft market exhibition at Jaisalmer Rajasthan, and few artisans were selected for further work in organized sector (Handicraft factory in Jodhpur) for much better working condition and earning, than past. Remaining artisans also working hard and we are planning to give few more marketing opportunities to them in future.
